

Drought Tolerant Plants

If you wish to grow perennial flowers in an area pounded by the sun all day, consider plants that are drought-tolerant. The use of drought-tolerant plants will reduce time and money spent on irrigation. These types of plants are also known as xeriscape plants.

Many drought-tolerant plants are also tolerant of poor-to-average soils. Some even prefer poor soils. Consequently, in addition to drought tolerance, the following perennials were also selected with an eye to soil-quality requirements. Namely, none of them are plants on which you need to waste valuable humus. Save your hard-earned humus for plants that require a rich, fertile soil. The perennials on this list prefer soils that are well drained, and nothing facilitates drainage like plain old, infertile sand.
