They keep updating these wonderful and versatile plants and **"FlowerFull"** is a significant improvement of the old work horse "Annabelle." It features three times as many flowers on sturdy upright stems that won't flop in the wind and rain.

In the perennial section we are excited to introduce a golden Baptisia called **"Golden Anniversary."** This False Indigo features indigo blue flowers, all season interest and is deer resistant.

A little known native perennial called **"Clustered Mountain Mint"** is the plant of the year for 2025. It is a phenomenal pollinator plant and very easy to grow. Contrary to many mints it does not run wild.

Additionally, we are offering a selection of **annual cut flowers**, perfect for adding bursts of color and fragrance to your home. Pairing pollinator-friendly blooms with cut flower gardens allows you to enjoy the best of both worlds; sustainable gardening and timeless beauty indoors.

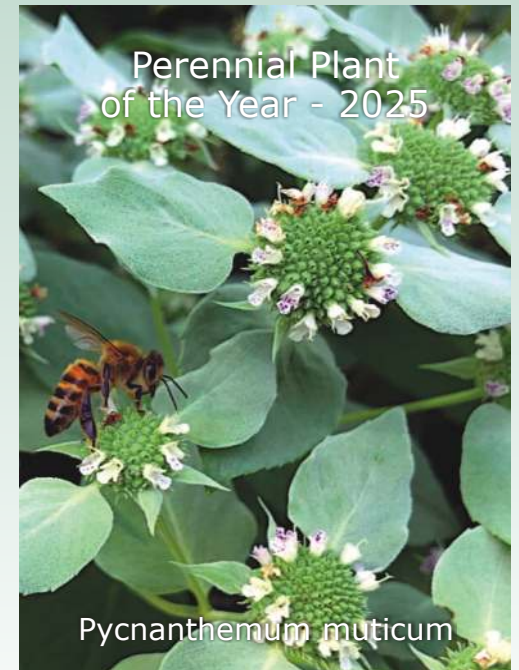

It has green and white foliage that forms a nice mound, white flowers tinted with a bit of lavender, and classic good looks.

**New for 2025:** The **Murraya Curry Tree** remains new and exotic to U.S. gardeners. Gardeners in our region will need to move this small tree between outdoors and in. Curry leaves are prized for their many uses, and the tree itself can be grown large or small. **Basil Kitchen Minis Bonsai** offers big flavor in a small package. Its leaves can be sprinkled on pastas, salads, strawberries... no need for chopping, as the leaves can't get much smaller.

**Ziziphora cli.** 'High Mountain Mint' has similarly tiny leaves plus white and pink blooms to decorate and flavor teas and yogurts. Don't worry about temperature spikes and dips with this plant: It handles change well. **Mint After Eight**, though not a candy, has looks, scent, and excellent flavor that are sweet as can be. And **Mexican Tarragon, Tagetes**, has the distinctive flavor of French Tarragon but tolerates dry spells and heat better.



Herbs grow beautifully. Herbs are beautiful. And planting new varieties of herbs will add to the sights, scents, and succulent tastes of summer. We can't promise that growing them will make you feel like you're on a trip to the Mediterranean, but we are quite sure they'll enhance your gardening, your cooking, and the way you savor summer.

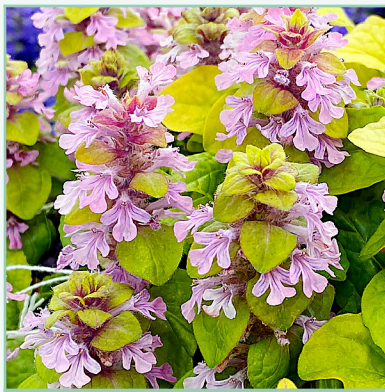




# A Selection of New Plants for 2025

**Achillea millefolium, Milly Rock Trio: p3**

Blooms yellow, rose pink, and red with a mounding, uniform habit. Long bloom time from late spring or early summer, well into the fall.



**Ajuga, Flashy Flamingo: p3**

Stunning bright golden foliage with pink flowers. Foliage does not burn in the sun. Use for borders or ground covers in the shade.



**Allium hollidicum, Little Sapphire: p3**

Purple star-shaped clusters of flowers that form a dense round sphere. Attracts pollinators and repels deer.



**Astrantia major, Sparkling Stars Pink: p5**

Featuring strawberry pink and cream umbels, this unique flower is like a mini fireworks display. This plant is beloved for its cut and dried flowers. Attractive to the human eye as well as pollinators.



**Baptisia hybrid, Golden Anniversary: p5**

Golden yellow foliage with indigo blue flowers makes this new baptisia fun and unique. Blooms in late spring to early summer.



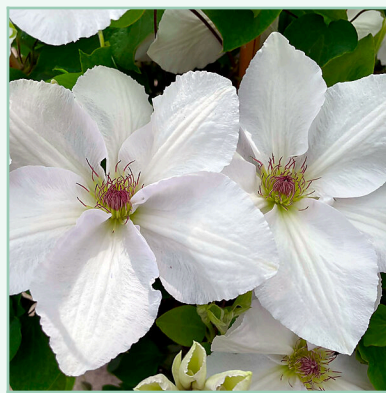
**Bergenia hybrid, Vintage Blush: p5**

Low growing glossy foliage with rose-pink flowers on sturdy red stems. In cooler temps the foliage will exhibit deeper burgundy tones.



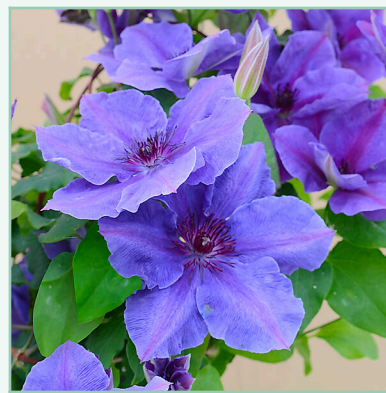
**Clematis, Adam's Courage: p6**

Spring flowers are lavender and deep fuchsia in color. Featuring pointed, overlapping petals to create a nice full flower and display burgundy anthers. Repeat bloomer.



**Clematis, Guemsey Flute: p6**

Stunning pure white, star-shaped flowers with red anthers. Flowers bloom in late spring and keep up through early fall.



**Clematis, Ravel: p6**

Velvety purple-blue blooms with purple center highlights. Compact and bushy vine with an abundance of flowers.



**Clematis, Tomaini: p7**

Compact and exceptionally free-flowering plant with large mauve-pink flowers and a dark pink bar in the center of the petal. In late summer, the flowers appear more violet in color.



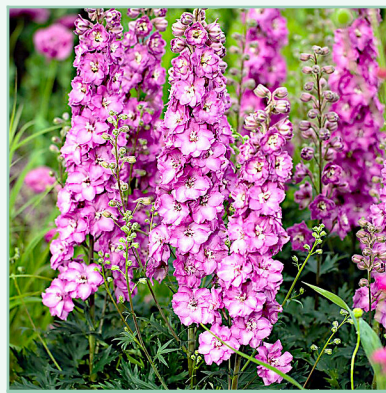
**Convallaria majalis, Albostrata: p7**

A wonderful ground cover with striking variegation that blooms mid to late spring with white bell-shaped flowers that give off a sweet scent.



**Delosperma cooperi, Delmara Pink: p7**

Low-growing succulent with pink flowers and yellow eyes. Tight, well-rounded habit and blooms all summer. Foliage turns burgundy in the fall.



**Delphinium hybrid, Delgenius Chantay: p7**

Lavender-pink flowers with a white bee. Compact, well-branched and upright habit.



**Delphinium hybrid, Delgenius Kingsley: p7**

Shades of deep purple-blue flowers. Compact, well-branched and upright habit.



**Dicentra formosa, Bacchanal: p7**

Blooming from late spring to early summer with small, deep crimson heart-shaped flowers enhanced with fine gray-green foliage. Thrives in part shade with good moisture and drainage.





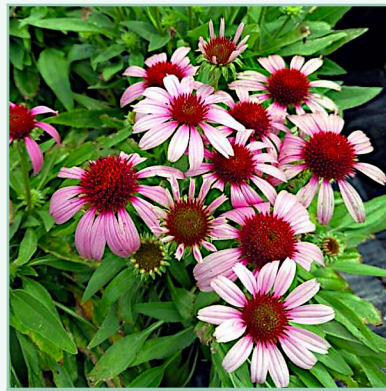
**Echinacea hybrid, Butter Pecan: p8**

Features fully double, 4 inch wide soft melon colored flowers that create a pom-pom effect. Plants are low, wide and well-branched.



**Echinacea hybrid, SunSeekers Mineola: p8**

Sports fragrant cones that start out green and turns dark as they mature. A semi-double with a tangerine-orange color. Compact habit with vivid color and great flower count.



**Echinacea hybrid, Vintage Lavender: p8**

Showy lavender flowers with a rusty brown center cone. Cold hardy, compact habit, excellent branching, and high flower count.



**Eupatorium fistulosum, JoJo: p8**

This native cultivar stays in its place, providing pink pom-pom flowers that last a long time. It will not spread by seed since it is sterile. This is a wonderful option for its long blooming and contained nature.



**Geranium hybrid, Perfect Storm: p9**

Featuring an abundance of little magenta-pink flowers with black center and veins. Great to fill in areas and when the blooms fade, it can be trimmed for a second flush of flowers.



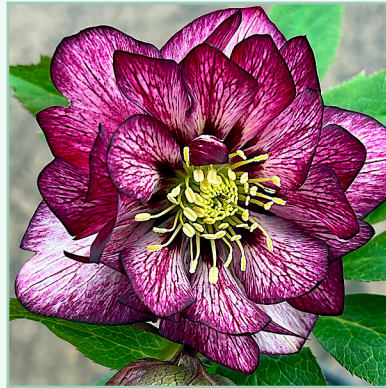
**Heliopsis heli., Summer Eclipse: p10**

Compact dark burgundy and green foliage that produces orange blooms with bright yellow edges. Thrives in sun and attracts pollinators.



**Helleborus, Swiss Alps: p10**

White flowers with a deep burgundy eye. Vigorous grower that produces an abundance of flowers.



**Helleborus, Whirlwind Romance: p10**

Displaying dark burgundy veins atop white petals. Blooms early spring to mid spring.

Bright white 8" flowers that display raspberry red eyes that extend through the petals. Well-rounded habit with broad green foliage and red stems.



**Hibiscus hybrid, Cookies and Cream: p11**

Pure white flowers stand out with a backdrop of dark, nearly black foliage. Creating 6-7" flowers with compact and sturdy stems. Best grown in full sun to showcase the dark foliage color.





**Hosta, Emperor's New Clothes: p12**

Arriving white in the spring this hosta is quick to develop its unique green and blue streaking. The only hosta of its kind to offer this marbled design.



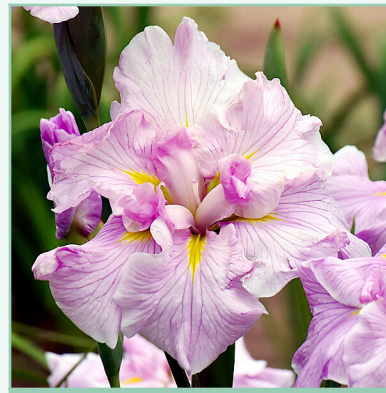
**Hosta, Gigantosaurus: p13**

A true giant! Expanding to 6ft wide and massive leaves to match this hostas size and deep blues will bring the Jurassic feel to your garden.



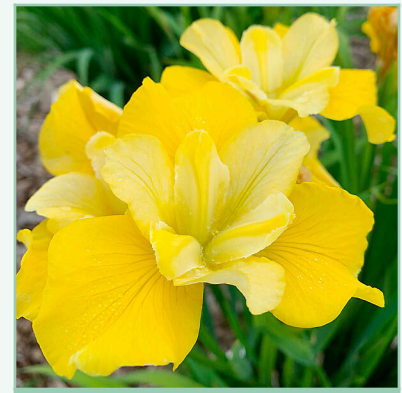
**Iris chrysographes, Black Form: p14**

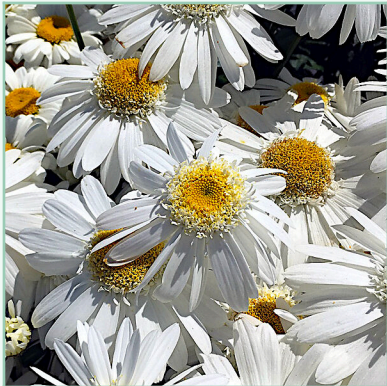
**Iris ensata, Pinkerton: p14**

Soft pink, 7" flowers with dark veining, rippled edges and yellow signals. This plant makes a wonderful spring accent for the edge of water gardens.



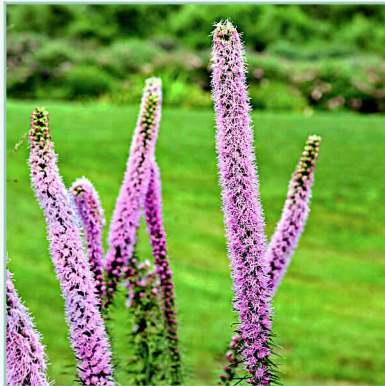
**Iris sibirica, Sunfisher: p14**

Burgundy flowers with white tips. Forming 5-6 flowers per stem. They remain moderately compact with sturdy stems.



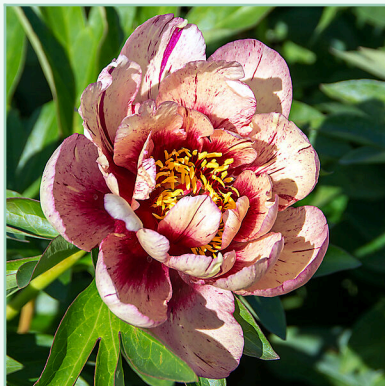
**Lilium orient., Sunday Double Bounty: p15**

**Monarda didyma, Electric Neon Coral: p16**

This frilly bloom displays 3 inch light coral-pink petals etched in dark veining. The foliage is dark green and creates a nice support. The flower is attractive to pollinators and is deer resistant.



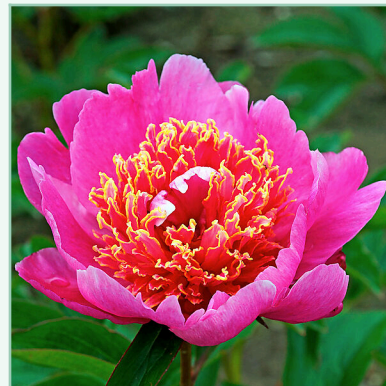
**Paeonia itoh, All That Jazz: p17**

Semi-double creamy-apricot petals with unmistakable reddish-purple streaks. Blooms are fragrant and held atop of strong stems with a mounding habit.

**Paeonia suffruticosa, Mistress: p17**

Double flowers appear pure white with occasional red striation on the central petals. They have sturdy stems and are sought after by florist. Blooms in mid season.





**Papaver orientale, Manhattan: p17**

Large double blooms feature shades of pink ruffled flowers with a black blot at the base of the petal. Produces a second flush of blooms later in the season.



**Papaver orientale, Red Rumble: p17**

Super-sized, bright red blooms are supported by strong, upright stems. The compact habit stays attractive while in bloom.



**Persicaria amplex, Blackfield: p18**

Well behaved and clumping. Showing off spikes of deep red flowers on long stems that bloom in the middle of summer into the fall.



**Phlox hybrid, Woodlander Pink: p18**

Produces large pink flowers that bloom in spring to summer. It is useful as a small-scale ground cover, pathway edging or accent in rock gardens or containers.



**Phlox paniculata, Flame Lilac Star: p18**

White flowers with lilac stripes are held on sturdy stems. Compact and tidy growth habit.



**Phlox paniculata, Material Girl: p18**

Sturdy stems hold up this fuchsia purple flower. This is one of the tallest phlox in the Garden Girls phlox collection. Performs best in full sun and pollinator friendly.



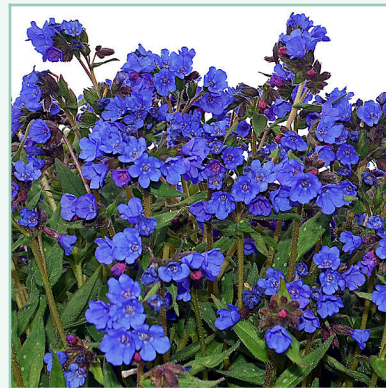
**Polemonium hybrid, Hurricane Ridge: p19**

Prolific blue flowers are fragrant and draw in pollinators. Blooms in mid summer with beautiful, dark green, mounded, fern-like foliage.



**Primula vulgaris, Oakleaf Blue: p19**

This primrose displays a beautiful yellow center surrounded by blue-violet petals that will surely catch your eye. Providing blooms several weeks in the spring will add charm to your shaded areas.



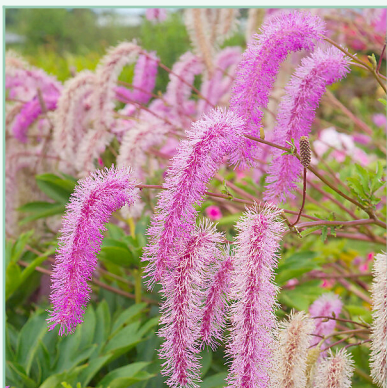
**Pulmonaria, Nova Cobalt: p19**

Displays delicate sky blue flowers that bloom throughout the summer. They thrive in moist to damp soil and a shady area.



**Veronica longifolia, Blue Skywalker: p21**

Lavender blue flowers are displayed in mid-summer. Great for tight areas that need some height.





**Hydrangea arb., FlowerFull: p27**

Three times the number of blooms as Annabelle, the many blooms of FlowerFull are held upright on sturdy stems through wind and rain. Disease-resistant and low maintenance.



**Physocarpus opul., Honeycomb: p28**

Easily shaped with pruning, a medium size ninebark with chartreuse leaves that turns to a glowing gold in the fall. Clusters of tiny white honeycomb shaped flowers fill the bush in spring.



**Acer rubrum, Brandywine: p31**

This shorter maple is an excellent choice for lawn, street, and park plantings since there is no seedling production due to sterile flowers. Fall color turns red then a vibrant reddish-purple.



**Campsis radicans, Balboa Sunset: p31**

Tubular, 3 to 4 inch dark red flowers in clusters of 6 to 12 create a dramatic show and attract hummingbirds. A clinging vine ideal for screening.



**Aesculus x bushii, Mystic Ruby: p32**

Resistant to leaf blotch and leaf scorch, this red flowered selection of buckeye is sure to catch the eye. A hybrid with improved hardiness.



**Betula nigra, Shiloh Splash: p32**

A dwarf birch that has dark green foliage with creamy white edges and the characteristic white peeling bark of a river birch. A great accent tree in any landscape.



**Magnolia x 'Susan', Susan: p32**

Standing about 10 feet at maturity with a low sweeping canopy, with dark-magenta, fragrant flowers in spring make this tree a wonderful accent piece in a garden.



**Malus, Courageous: p33**

An eye-catching crab for any area, pink flowers fill the tree in early spring. New growth emerges maroon in the spring, takes on a green-bronze hue in summer then lights up a yellow-orange hue in fall.



**Tilia x mongolica, Harvest Gold: p33**

Beautiful golden buds in summer foreshadow the golden glow of the leaves in fall. Cold hardy as well as heat resistant and very resistant to sun scald and leaf spot.



**Picea orientalis, Firefly: p35**

Spring needle growth starts a brilliant yellow then softens to gold as the season progresses. Shade will dull the foliage to green so full sun is best for this compact spruce.



**Picea pungens, Moonstone Globe: p35**

A small globe blue spruce, it maintains its compact rounded form with low maintenance. Vivid blue needles for a pop of color in any landscape.



**Prunus, Pembina: p37**

A great large dessert plum with red skin and sweet, juicy, yellow flesh. Good for eating fresh, cooking, and preserves, Pembina blooms in early spring and will need a pollinator.



**Pyrus, Luscious: p37**

A one-of-a-kind spreading floss flower that monarch butterflies can't resist! The habit is large and shrub-sized, with soft round edges that fill the space.



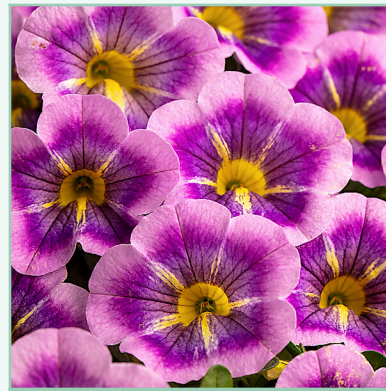

## Water Gardening

Few things are as peaceful as a water garden. Although water gardening seems as though it might be a challenge, it is very much within reach of all who love nature. Given the right plants, and keeping just a few guidelines in mind, your garden vista can echo that of Monet's Garden and welcome in dragonflies, butterflies, bees, friends and family... and perhaps even a painter who wants to capture the look of your garden on canvas.

**New and Worth Mentioning:** The unique **Colocasia 'Waikiki'** is an Elephant Ear with corrugated leaves that undergo color changes as they mature. Give it good sun, and it will put on a color show, showing its "best self" after its second year of growth. For shadier spots in your water garden, **Colocasia 'Pharaoh's Mask'** offers unmissable dark purple veining on green leaves. The leaves curl under in a way that makes each one look like a pillow of color... perfect resting spot for a dragonfly. And finally, we love the **Cannova® 'Golden Leopard' Canna**. With golden blooms that have orange spots, this Canna will show beautifully, with good height and exotic coloration.



**Tips for Planting:** When an aquatic plant is to be placed in a bog bed surrounding a pond, the plant can be treated the same as any perennial. But for plants which will be planted in the floor of a pond, peat-based potting mediums containing perlite, the white porous substance so commonly seen in plant grow-pots, are not the best. The perlite floats, making the pond unsightly. What is worse, the peat will turn pond water brown and eventually decay, promoting algae blooms. So, at Winter Greenhouse, we find it is best to use a heavy clay soil that is top-dressed with gravel, a special aquatic planting medium called calcified clay, or common pea gravel. We like all three, but most beneficial is the calcified clay, which does not float or decay, is clean, holds water, absorbs nutrients, helps eliminate algae bloom, and can be reused when re-potting the plant.

Generally, before aquatic plants are added to a pond, they should be transplanted in larger containers for plenty of room to grow. We have found the best containers for this purpose to be fine-meshed aquatic fabric bags which retain the potting medium but let water penetrate. We add one scoop of slow-release aquatic fertilizer per gallon of container size. This gives the plants enough nutrients to put forth plenty of growth and blooms during the season.

If you are considering creating or adding to a pond, know that we are happy to assist you. We have **handouts** filled with useful tips based on years of experience with our own ponds. Water gardening is a worthwhile effort with great rewards.

You can also check online where a full list will be posted. With that notation in place, you can be sure of getting a bargain during our opening sale. Other plants will be offered as QT (quart) containers or BB (ball and burlap). Most of the largest container sizes will be available at the time of opening, whereas all quart containers and most of the new evergreens will be available between mid-May and Memorial Day. **New in 2025:** Flowers are some of our greatest loves, and it is the flowering shrubs that often get us most excited about a new growing season. In 2025, there is a great deal that is new and sure to be a hit in our Wisconsin gardens. **Hydrangea ‘FlowerFull’** has classic white flowers, up to 3 times as many blooms, and it has been bred to show those flowers on stems that are strong and will not droop. The **‘Pop Star’ Reblooming Hydrangea** is a Lacecap with blooms in vibrant blue or pink. Its colors are hard not to notice, far more saturated and “electric” than the blooms of other Hydrangeas. It has multitudes of flowers, and it holds up with great strength. When it comes to an option that can be grown as a small tree or shrub, **Betula ‘Shiloh Splash’** is a River Birch that provides good color and fluttery foliage movement to a garden. If grown as a tree, you can expect this River Birch to reach about 15 feet tall with a 10-foot canopy width. But what is more important is its expected longevity. This Birch, which has been bred to withstand high winds and other challenges, is expected to reach about 70 years of age, disease-free. The **‘Courageous®’ Crabapple** is all about color. We love its bright pink flowers which are dramatic against bronze-red foliage that turns orange in autumn. With a maximum height at maturity of 20 feet and a 15-foot spread of its canopy, it will perfume your garden while in bloom, shade your garden in summer, and accent your other plantings. Not a fruiting variety, this accent tree stays neat. For all of us who love the Snowball Bush, the **Snowball Viburnum Tree Form** takes a classic favorite and never ceases to amaze all of us gardeners with its ability to hold pretty white puffy blooms upright in what appears to be a tree canopy. And to accompany the white Snowballs, the **‘Spice Girl’ Viburnum** has pink buds which open to white, perfuming the garden with spicy-sweet fragrance.

## Tips for Growing Fruit Trees and Small Fruits

**Pollination of apple trees:** The tree should be within 100 feet of the pollinator tree. Length of bloom is 7-15 days. Crabapple trees can also be used as pollinators for apple trees. Early bloomers need early or mid-season apple trees as pollinator. Late bloomers pollinate with late or mid-season bloomers. Mid-season bloomers can use all apple trees as pollinators. • Most **pears** are only partially self-fertile, thus yields increase with two or more trees. Most pears that bloom at the same time are suitable pollinators. Pears require more pollinators and bees than any other fruit. • All **American plums** flowering at the same time will pollinate each other, but Toka or native plums are the best pollinators. European plums are generally self-fertile – like Mt. Royal. • **Cherries** are self fertile. • **Honeyberries** require two different varieties to pollinate. • **Blueberries** generally have better pollination and higher yields when two different varieties are planted together. Chippewa is self-fruitful and Northcountry is partially self-fruitful. Our other blueberries require another blueberry variety in order to pollinate. • **Yezberries** are self-pollinating, but use 2 varieties for biggest fruits and best yields.

**Soil Requirements:** Fruit trees & small fruits appreciate a loamy soil with good drainage and pH 6-7. Blueberries require rich, well drained acid soil (pH 4.5-5.5) in order to thrive.

**Please Note:** *Fruit Ripens* refers to Minnesota. In Northern Wisconsin (Zone 3-4) fruit ripens 1-2 weeks later!

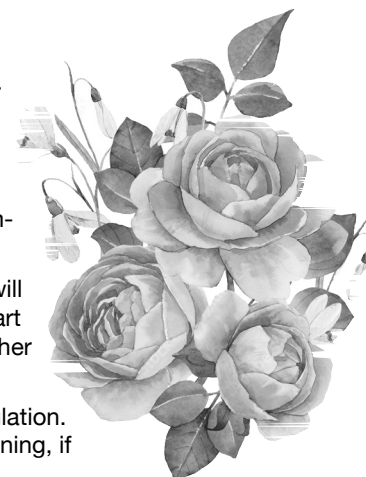
**New for 2025:** The **Oso Easy En Fuego® Rose** blooms and re-blooms in “on-fire” red, orange, and yellow tones. This disease-resistant shrub rose will not need deadheading and fares well in both heat and cold. **Easy Elegance® My Girl Rose** almost endlessly rebloom easily with ruffled buds that start dark pink, aging to a lighter pink and opening up to reveal a golden yellow center. Far more disease resistant and cold and heat tolerant than many other roses on the market. Finally, for a “new classic”, there is **Rosa ‘Reminiscent® Yellow’**: Its fragrant yellow double-blooms are full and ruffled.

**Growing roses:** Roses need bright sun for six straight hours. Try not to crowd them out, as they need adequate space around them for good air circulation. Roses thrive in loosely packed soil with excellent drainage, and they appreciate compost as a soil amendment. Water deeply once a week, in the morning, if there has not been at least an inch of rain.

**We recommend the following products for low-maintenance, effective Rose care:**

- For spring fertilizers, we recommend **‘Espoma Rose-tone®’** or **‘Fertilome Start & Grow’**. Bonemeal also can be applied to promote blooming.
- We recommend **‘Espoma Earth-tone® 3n1 Disease Control’** or **‘Fertilome Triple Action’** (neem oil plus pyrethrins) as excellent products for controlling common insects and diseases.
- **Deer problems** can be handled by applying repellents such as **‘Bobbex Rose™ Deer & Insect Repellent’** and **‘Repellex® Systemic Granular’**. **Bobbex-Rose** promises an environmentally friendly way to repel pests through taste aversion. The undesirable taste that deer and such insects as aphids will experience from **Bobbex**-treated Roses will not lessen after watering or rain. A sticking agent keeps the formulation in place after it is sprayed on. And **Repellex®** is a granular product which gets sprinkled onto the ground and watered in. Dissolved granules send hot pepper concentrate throughout all parts of the plants. Animals steer clear of these plants, which absorb the formula to the cellular level where it remains all season to do its job.

**Japanese beetles** pose problems for Roses. With stages in their life cycle unfolding both below and above ground, they are a challenge at best. The absence of native predators means that more than one strategy must be used to keep the garden free of this particular pest. Methods can be mechanical, such as meshing and netting, manual in the sense of removing the pests one-by-one, trapping, using natural insecticides, and combining chemicals and biocontrol agents. 

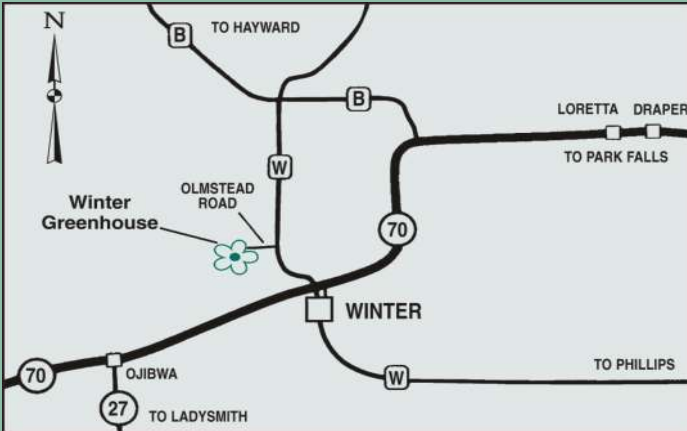
