Beet, Bulls Blood	○	58 baby		An old favorite! Tastes great cooked and the burgundy leaves are good for salads or microgreens. Foliage color intensifies with plant maturity. Roots show candy-striped zoning when sliced.
Beet, Chioggia Guardsmark	○	60		Sweet, mild, peppery flavor with unusual bullseye stripes of white and magenta/red. 3-3.5" fruits and mild flavored greens packed with nutrition. Looks spectacular with a satisfying flavor!
Bok, Choy Purple Lady	○	40		Contains high levels of antioxidants with anti-aging properties, and a sweet, rich flavor perfect for wok, grill or in salads. Crunchy, juicy and flavorful, an excellent culinary variety.
Broccoli, Castle Dome	○	53		Improved Packman. Heat tolerant. Fine to plant successive for continues harvest. After you have taken the side shoots - there comes more and more shoots, still developing into a tons of flowers for your bees and butterflies.
Broccoli, Green Magic	○	57		Smooth, well-domed and uniform heads with a buttery texture and great flavor. Exceptional heat- tolerance and produce second and third harvests.
Broccoli, Lieutenant	○	80		Erect plants with minimal side shoots, medium size main stems with reduced hollow stern. Smooth crowns have minimal bract leaves during hot weather. Dark green crowns with medium sized beads.
Broccoli, Marathon	○	75		Highly tolerant to cold temperatures. Makes large, firm heads and after harvest comes with plenty of still nice size side shoots into late fall. Our highest yielding favorite.
🌸 Broccoli, Purple Magic	○	62		This purple broccoli is magical! How else do you explain a broccoli that has it all? From its beautiful purple color, tight uniform heads and bright beads to its great broccoli flavor, this easy to grow broccoli is also stress and heat tolerant. A showstopper. Excellent broccoli to try growing in cooler seasons.
Brussel, Sprouts Franklin	○	80		The earliest to ripen. Taste is improved with a few light frosts. The tall plants have less woody stalks than other varieties, so whole stem harvest is possible.
🌸 Brussels Sprouts, Redarling	○	145		Truly a darling in the Brussels Sprout patch, ReDarling reliably produces strong, uniform plants with 24 inch towers of purple sprouts. Each elongated button is firm and beautiful, stacking on sturdy stems for whole-stalk harvests.
🌸 Brussels Sprouts, Silvia	○	103		Silvia is a great choice for small gardens. Grows on a compact plant that reaches 2' tall. They may be short but they are packed full of 45+ sprouts per stalk. This early maturing variety is great roasted, sautéed or steamed. For the sweetest flavor harvest in the fall after several frost. Sprouts are medium-large, round, and very dense.
Brussels, Sprouts Rubine (Tasty Red)	○	85		The 1-1.5 inch purple-red sprouts are filled with antioxidants. Slightly nutty and much sweeter flavor than their green counterpart. Prefers firm, rather than loose soil. HEIRLOOM

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Cabbage, Brunswick	○	85-95		An heirloom from 1924. Large drumhead cabbage, very cold hardy. A fall/winter type cabbage that stores very well.
Cabbage, Flat Dutch Late	○	100		Large, broad flat heads, 10-15 pounds, low growing, short cored.
Cabbage, Kalibos	○	78		Beautiful bright red pointed cabbage. The best red cabbage of this type with an average head weight of 1.5 to 2 pounds. Head shape will vary from highly to moderately pointed. Color ranges from a deep red to a pale, almost pinkish red.
Cabbage, Ruby Perfection	○	85		Sweet red heads, 3-3.5 pounds, slow to split, heat and cold tolerant.
Cabbage, Savoy Alcosa	○	55		Early producer of round, 2-4 lb., deep blue-green, crinkled heads. Alcosa's well-packed, thin, yellow interior leaves quickly fill in, making it a smart choice for closely spaced plantings of mini cabbages. Flavor improves with cold weather. Best in cooked dishes. Intermediate resistance to downy mildew.
Cabbage, Stonehead	○	67		Round, rock solid, short cored, creamy white interior, crisp texture, 4-6 pounds.
Cantaloupe, Sarah's Choice	○	76		One of the most flavorful cantaloupe on the market. The three pound size fruit has a sweet, juicy flesh.
Caraflex	○	68		Extremely uniform, small heads with good wrapper leaves for insect and sun protection. Inner leaves are tender, crunchy, and have an excellent, sweet and mild cabbage flavor. Perfect for summer salads, slaws, or cooked dishes.
Cardoon, Cynara cardunculus (Artichoke Thistle)	○			The large spiny, silvery foliage will make a dramatic statement in the garden. In certain climates, globe-like, violet-topped flowers can appear the second year. An ornamental edible as the stems can be blanched and eaten.
Cauliflower, Amazing	○	68		Large, solid white heads both in warm and cold weather. Plant successive and you can harvest high yields into late fall. The absolute favorite in our climate.
Cauliflower, Fioretto 70		60		Nut-like flavor, sweeter than large-head cauliflowers. A slightly flattened 8-14 inch head with creamy curds atop a somewhat loose bouquet of longer stems. As the head begins to expand into slightly spaced irregularity, each floret gently extends into a single-serve branch that should be harvested individually. Produces side shoots for an additional harvest.
Cauliflower, Multi Head White	○	75		Easily branches with multiple heads per plant. Does not turn bitter in the sun. Small leaves.
Cauliflower, Snow Crown	○	50-60		Snow Crown is always mild and sweet. Its hybrid vigor and rapid growth make it one of the easiest to grow of all early cauliflower varieties. It forms fully domed curds in heads 7-8 inches across, weighing 1-2 pounds.
Celeriac, Mars	○	95		Large, uniform roots with big, healthy plants. Interiors stay firm, even when roots are large. Holds well in the field.
Celery, Peppermint Stick	○	80		A real culinary delight with its unique candy pink and green stalks shade to green leaves. Use the leaves and stalks for fresh seasoning all year. Keeps its color when cooked and very slow to bolt.
Cucumber, Bush Pickle	○	48		Small bushy plant, green fruit, 4- 5 inch cukes, can be grown in containers.

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Cucumber, Green Light	○	37		2020 AAS Edible Vegetable Winner! A higher yield than comparison varieties, earlier maturity, excellent eating quality and more attractive fruit. Pick fruits when 3-4" long and no need to peel them.
Cucumber, Martini	○	55-60		Stands out from the competition for its non-yellowing white exterior and earlier yields. Very tender, "no peel" skin if harvested at 5 -6 inches in length. Powdery mildew resistant and staying power in the heat of Summer. White interior is bitter-free, very sweet and crunchy.
Cucumber, Mexican Sour Gherkin	○	67		Fruits look like miniature watermelons and taste like cucumbers with tangy citrus overtones. Vines grow 4 to 7 feet long and attract hummingbirds!
Cucumber, Mini-Me	○	45		An early variety that sets small, uniform, almost spineless fruits, about 2-3 inches long. A thin, smooth skin and mild, slightly sweet flavor. Good fresh, pickled or for beverages.
Cucumber, Quirk	○	52		Uniquely attractive mini cucumber for snacking and pickling. Short vines produce heavy yields of tasty two inch fruits. An attention-grabbing mini with striking contrast between bright green and gleaming white. Daily harvest is recommended.
Cucumber, Summer Dance	○	55		Glossy, deep-green 9 inch fruits with a sweet flavor. A burpless variety with high yields. High resistance to Downy and Powdery mildew. Japanese type tolerant to heat stress.
Cucumber, Sweet Success	○	52-64		Crisp texture, long dark green fruit on vining plant, can be trained on trellis, 10 inch cucumbers. SWEET SLICE SUBSTITUTE.

Cucumber, Sweeter Yet	○	48		Cucumbers don't come any sweeter than these glossy, deep green, extra-sweet small cucumbers. Enjoy these slender, cucumbers in salads or as snacks. They arrive early, produce prolifically all summer long. Sweet, mild taste, non-acidic, and burpless.
Dahlia, Hypnotica Tequila Sunrise	○			You might need a pair of 3-D glasses to appreciate the color and depth of this plant. These full-sun beauties will look stunning in a dramatic container with reds, yellows and oranges.
Edamame, Tohya				An early maturing variety that produces an abundance of plump, well formed furry pods, typically yielding 3 seeds each, on compact, well formed plants that average 24" inches tall. The pods mature in a concentrated set for easy harvesting.
Eggplant, Classic	○	76		A glossy, purple-black color eggplant. Fruits are 8" to 9" size with a teardrop shape.
🌸 Eggplant, Icicle	○	55-75		Icicle eggplants has fewer spines than most eggplants, making for a less painful harvest! With larger fruits than other white eggplants, it produces a nice yield of about 8-9 fruits while also providing fewer seeds. The large, durable, and vigorous plants hold up to insect damage and the environment. Improved taste.
Eggplant, Millionaire	○	63		Smooth, very attractive type with good flavor. Delicious in stir-fry dishes. Slender fruits, 2 inches across, 8-10 inches long that are borne early on upright plants. Proven tops for performance, flavor and wide adaptability.
🌸 Eggplant, Thanos	○	65		Strong spineless plants produce high early yields of fruit with the classic blocky bell shape. Spineless calyx for easier harvesting. High yields, better uniformity, darker colors.

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Fennel, Orazio	○	50		Large, thick, rounded bulbs. Crisp and flavorful with a nice anise flavor. 'Orazio' has heavier bulbs giving it a higher yield potential than flatter, open-pollinated fennels.

Flowering, Kale Crane Red		90-110		Grow tight. Once plants are about 10-12" tall, remove the lower leaves. Repeat 3 or 4 times as the plants grow taller. Great cut flower.
Flowering, Kale Glamour Red	○	90		AAS winner 2011. Glamour is the first flowering kale with glossy leaves.
🌸 Gourd, Daisy	○	95		A small, ornamental gourd with a daisy pattern on the stem end that comes in a variety of colors and shapes.
Kale, Prizm	○	50-60		2016 AAS Vegetable Award Winner! Prizm produces attractive short, tight ruffle-edged leaves that can be grown in containers as well as in-ground beds. Their easy-to-maintain, almost stemless stalks are quick to re-leaf so harvest early and often for a continual supply throughout the season. The excellent tasting, somewhat nutty flavored leaves are tender enough to enjoy in fresh salads and also perfect for soups and your favorite cooked dishes. Prizm is a foodie gardener's dream come true!
Kale, Winterbor	○	75		Excellent cold crop. Leaves are well-curled, blue-green, and ruffled. Vigorous plants will continue growing to produce leaves for successive harvests as the lower leaves are harvested.
Kohlrabi, White Vienna	○	58		Sweet, mild, nut like flavor, great source of Vitamin C.
Leek, King Richard (early)	○	75		Extra long slim stems, early season June-July, late season Aug-Sept., will stay ready for Christmas.
Lettuce, Adriana	○	48		Heat tolerant, dark green butterhead. 'Adriana' is large and has a broad disease package. Heads are full and dense with good flavor. Good tolerance to tipburn, and bolting. High resistance to downy mildew
Lettuce, Alfresco Mix	○	14-21		Red and green leaf lettuces with arugula, endive and radicchio. Makes a delicious and nutritious salad. Harvest every 3 weeks by cutting down to 2 inches.
Lettuce, Bauer	○	34		2022 AAS Winner! Compact oakleaf, medium green with lobed leaves. Nice flavor with thick, crunchy leaf texture. Harvest heads at mini to medium size for best flavor. Easy to grow.
🌸 Lettuce, Buttercrunch	○	55-65		Buttercrunch has been setting the standard for classic butterhead type lettuce for many years. Its soft, buttery-textured leaves enclose a crisp, juicy, loose inner head of blanched, sweet-tasting leaves. Very heat tolerant and slow to bolt. Buttercrunch stays mild long after others have turned bitter.

New, Zealand Spinach	○	55-65		Not a true spinach, but similar in flavor and usage. Keep picking the young shoots when about 3 inches long and tender and the plant will continue branching out with new shoots through the sommerheat until frost. Blanch and freeze down for the winter as
Onion, Candy (Sweet Golden)	○	135		Candy has taken American gardens by storm! This huge, savory yellow onion, with thick, succulent flesh and a delicious flavor both sharp and sweet can be grown just about anywhere! Candy is a day-neutral variety that can be stored for months.
Onion, Echalion Crème Brulee	○	98		2021 AAS Winner! Easy to peel, single-centered bulbs have a bright coppery pink outer skin with a rosy-purple interior with thick rings. A slight citrusy flavor when eaten raw and no overpowering aftertastes when carmelized.
Onion, Frontier	○	100		Frontier has excellent size and uniformity and a small neck. A very firm yellow onion that under optimum storage conditions is the best keeper. Divide and plant out in a row - 6 inches apart.
Onion, Red Baron Bunching		118		Versatile, long-day variety keeps its dark red outer skin color and purple ring color well. Harvest at 12-15 inches tall as a scallion, or in fall with a mid-size, mild flavored bulb. Long storage, vigorous roots.
🌸 Onion, Red Nugent	○	113		A hybrid, long-day onion variety that matures earlier than most red onion varieties. Excellent interior quality, good bolt tolerance, good uniformity and high early season yields.

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Onion, Red Zeppelin	○	90		Purple and beautiful, sweet, juicy sandwich onions. Stores well. Divide and plant out in a row - 6 inches apart.
Onion, Shallot Conserver	○	145		A French type, Conserver has an elongated, slightly teardrop shape with papery reddish-copper skins and deep pink flesh. It has a fine texture and a delicate, sweet flavor, between onion and garlic. Long storage life.
Parsley, Curled	○	70-90		Decorative, closely curled dark green leaves, fast growing, used for garnishes or flavor.
Parsley, Italian	○	70-90		Clump-forming plants, great for garnishes or for flavor. Strong flavor - a favorite of chef's.
Pea, Sugar Magnolia Tendril	○	70		Purple pods and bright green interiors. Delicious, sweet snap peas for salads, steamed or sauteed. Best flavor when harvested just before pods are fully filled out.
Pepper, Anaheim MILD Chili	○	75-80		A mild, medium sized chili pepper that grows to 6-10 inches, often used when green, though it can be used when red. The basic variety ripens to a dark green/reddish color, but other strains ripen to full red. They are one of the most common chilis in the United States and are used in many foods and recipes. Red varieties can be strung together and dried to make ristras and wreaths.
Pepper, Buena Mulata (Hot Pepper)	○	75-80		A hot pepper, extremely productive and very rare! This pepper ripens from violet to orange then to red. When ripe the heat level is similar to a cayenne pepper. Pods reach 6 to 7 inches in length.
Pepper, Cajun Belle	○	60		A sweet pepper with a mild but spicy heat. Ripen from lime green to orange to red. Edible at any stage. Longer maturity gives increased flavor. Miniature pepper that will add zip to any dish!
Pepper, Candy Cane Red	○	60-65		Snack pepper has unique, eye-catching variegated foliage, plus fruit that ripen from green striped to solid red. Sweet flavor, thin walls, crispy texture. Perfect for fresh eating at any stage of ripeness. Best for container or in-ground, with or without support.
🌿 Pepper, Cayenne Wild Cat	○	75		A cayenne pepper with extra-large, 2-3 ounce, fruits. A high-yielding plant with nice thick, fleshy walls that are thicker than comparisons. The 8" fruits are straighter than traditional cayenne fruits with a great smoky flavor and peppery sweetness and a mild pungency of 500-1500 Scoville units. Mild heat level makes this a good multi-purpose plant for everyone's garden!
Pepper, Dragonfly	○	75		2022 AAS Winner! Purple peppers with thick, sweet walls and robust pepper flavor. Transforms from green into purple delicious at both stages of maturity. If left on the vine, turns to bright red.
Pepper, Garden Salsa	○	73		Just the right amount of heat (3,000 Scovilles) for the Mexican sauces and fresh salsa you love!
Pepper, Golden California Wonder	○	62-73		Smooth, blocky, 5" x 4" fruits are thick-walled, very sweet and mild. Maturing from light-green to golden-yellow.
Pepper, Habanero	○	80		Among the hottest peppers anywhere, Habanero reaches up to 215,000 Scovilles of heat! Small, bright orange fruits.

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Pepper, Jalapeno	○	70		Small, hot, great for salsas. Can be eaten green or red.
Pepper, Just Sweet	○	65		2019 AAS Winner! Plants are vigorous growers (up to 36" tall and 15" wide) and don't need to be staked, they have been bred to have a strong bushy habit. Bright, shiny yellow color with a sweet, aromatic flavor.

Pepper, Lola Banana		65		Thick-walled, light yellow and mild tasting. Slowly ripen to orange and then finally to bright red. Great disease resistance.
Pepper, New Ace	○	65		Extra-early, highly productive standard. Large fruits with excellent flavor for cooking.
Pepper, North Star	○	70		Reliable, cold hardy producer of plenty sweet fruits.
Pepper, Orange Blaze	○	68		AAS Winner 2011. Ripens early to a beautiful orange color, it has a very sweet flavor and grows 3 to 4-inch long fruits about 1.5 inches wide.
Pepper, Ornamental Acapulco Multicolor	○	100		An array of compact, orange and purple, drought tolerant fruit perfect for fall arrangements. And a great indoor plant for a sunny location.
Pepper, Ornamental Chilly Chili	○	49		Small, very mild. Used in Disney World, it is kid friendly.
Pepper, Ornamental Hot Pops Purple	○	60-90		Fruiting ornamental pepper. Small, round peppers of both purple and orange simultaneously make a high impact display for outdoor and indoor decorating. Compact, heavily branched plants work well in mixed containers, color bowls and planted with Mums. Note: Fruit is very hot.
Pepper, Ornamental Numex Easter	○	72		AAS Winner 2014. A compact, well branched, uniform Pepper that displays small clusters of 4-6 fruits on top of the plant in a range from lavender to light yellow and when fully mature a light orange. The colors of the fruit resemble the pastel colors of E
Pepper, Ornamental Onyx Orange				Purple/black fruits matures to orange and red respectively. Its attractive compact, branching habit, bold dark foliage and shiny red fruit made in a 2023 All-America Selections winner.
🌸 Pepper, Ornamental Onyx Red	○			Stunning double-take plants that steal the show! Black foliage and tons of shiny red fruits is striking and makes a bold statement. Plants are vigorous, continually growing but retain their neat, compact habit, making Onyx Red a wonderful plant for beds, borders, containers and dramatic mass plantings.
Pepper, Ornamental Purple Flash	○			Almost black leaves are layered to reveal flashes of electric purple. Bears glossy black fruits that are attractive but too hot to be palatable.
Pepper, Ornamental Sangria	○	85-120		A cute ornamental plant which bears fruit that resembles confetti. Young peppers emerge green, then advance through colors of orange, purple, and finally on to a brilliant red. Sangria peppers are edible, but they're not typically grown for their flavor.

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Pepper, PeppiGrande Red	○	60-85		A corno pepper that ripens from green to red. Outstanding crisp texture, rich flavor and more sweetness than large-fruited peppers. Great grilled or cheese-stuffed and baked.
Pepper, Pot-a-peno	○	45-50		2021 AAS Edible Vegetable Winner! Small, green jalapeno fruit have a traditional spicy zip that is great in any dish. Ripen to red for a spicy, sweet flavor.
Pepper, Prism F1		75-80		Sweet medium bells matures from light green to orange, and then to red. Can be harvested at all stages of maturity.
☼ Pepper, Red Impact	○	75		Thick, sweet walls, even when green. Much sweeter than other varieties and loaded with fruits for a high yielding gem. Red Impact plants are upright and tidy, with a strong disease resistance. The fruit is dark red, highly uniform in shape and size, and if you are looking for a delicious and easy-to-grow pepper.
Pepper, Red Knight	○	78		Early-maturing and blocky bell pepper. It produces an extra large fruit that goes from green to bright red at maturity. Excellent for stuffing and grilling.
Pepper, Roulette	○	87		This 2018 AAS National Winner has 1 oz. fruits that are red with thick walls when it matures and a nice citrusy (No Heat) habanero flavor! Matures faster than other habaneros in its class.
Pepper, Shishito Dragon Roll	○	67		Shishito peppers are on menus and at farmers markets across the nation. These 3 to 5-inch peppers top out at about 200 Scovilles, making them milder than a jalapeño pepper, but letting you know you got some heat.
Pepper, Sriracha	○	65-70		Make your own Red Rooster Hot Sauce. Large and firm, uniformly dark green pepper with beautiful smooth skin and thick wall. Long shelf life and good heat content. Make your own Sriracha Hot Red Rooster Sauce!
Pepper, Sugar Rush Peach	○	80-100		A sumptuous snacking pepper, long, peach colored fruits are packed with loads of super sweet, tropical flavor, and the seeds bring a smokey, complex heat. A great balance of sweet and heat at about the level of habaneros.
Pepper, Super Chili	○	84		Small, very hot, flavor is more intense when green.
Pepper, Sweet Banana	○	70		AAS Winner. Mild, tangy taste. Large, pointed fruits measure 6-7 inches long and 1½ inches across. The mild yellow peppers ultimately turn brilliant red. A favorite for pickling.
Pepper, Sweet Heat	○	56		The earliest to bear fruit, compact and bushy. It has 3 to 4 inch long by 1 to 1.5 inch wide peppers that are sweet and mildly spicy like pepperoncini, with a great smoky flavor. 'Sweet Heat' can be harvested green or red, and is perfect for grilling or s
☼ Pepper, Wicket Ghost	○	110		Spicy hybrid of the infamous Ghost pepper. These plants are early maturing and produce dozens of peppers! Super hot 800,000 Scoville units of heat. The 10th hottest. Be careful handling and consuming.
Pepper, Yum Yum	○	72		The small peppers measure nearly two inches long and have three lobes, and an elongated conical shape. Yum Yum peppers have medium-thick walls and a crisp, crunchy texture. The peppers are flavorful and sweet.
